As much as we may wish otherwise, the "golden years" are never entirely stress-free. It's true that seniors often have more time to plan trips, socialize with friends, go to the beach, play golf and tennis, dine out, enjoy hobbies and spend time with family.

However, stress can still be a barrier.

Stress is a reaction to challenging circumstances, and coping is difficult for many seniors. Factors such as unstructured time, possible changes in family relationships, the loss of a spouse, and physical problems with vision, hearing, balance, and mobility all can have an impact. In addition, finding affordable housing, or choosing an independent or assisted living facility can be extremely trying, especially for seniors on fixed incomes.

Keeping up with new technology can also be a challenge, as some older adults struggle to use a computer, iPad, iPhone, or other devices. This "technophobia" can lead to isolation, which in turn leads to stress and depression.

Princy Bhat-Bhardwaj is an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN), at Conviva Pine Island in South Florida. Conviva is a leading provider of primary health care services for seniors, with hundreds of center locations in Florida and Texas. Bhat-Bhardwaj knows stress firsthand. As a teen she became a refugee in her native India following acts of terrorism, and the mental scars remained into adulthood. She now works daily with seniors and says yoga and meditation are tremendous stress relievers for both young and old alike.

"I was always passionate about healthcare, and when I came to America I had the opportunity to go back to school and earn degrees at both Florida Atlantic and Florida International universities," she said. The nurse practitioner also has certifications in psychology and primary mental health and is passionate about the mental needs and happiness of senior patients. "I know personally how debilitating stress can be, and even though I was outwardly happy, the mental wounds still needed to heal," said Bhat-Bhardwaj.

Personal Turning Point

During her most challenging times, Bhat-Bhardwaj discovered an online meditation program that offers resources for people to take charge of their body, mind, emotions, and energy and live a more joyful, fulfilling life.

Unique Care

According to Bhat-Bhardwaj, a senior's mental health is extremely important, and yoga can create an emotional balance, increase energy levels and provide more bliss. "If you really listen to what seniors have to say, their lives are like a book; all you have to do is allow them to open the pages," she said. "They have so much wisdom, and so there's so much to learn."

She says three factors weigh heavily on the minds of most seniors - mortality, a fear of being isolated from family members and ongoing chronic pain. "Older adults need to reduce stress because it's a major factor in declining health," said Bhat-Bhardwaj. "Emotionally, older populations are becoming more depressed, especially those dealing with chronic, daily pain."

Conviva centers, including Conviva Dania Pointe and Conviva West Pines, offer patients chair yoga classes to manage and reduce stress.

How do seniors combat stress? "I advise them to be themselves and take control of their inner feelings, and be true to who you are," said Bhat-Bhardwaj. "The tools to make that transformation are out there, you just have to look for them."

The Athlete's Elbow Part 2

Little league elbow is a common problem in the growing athlete and describes medial elbow pain that is attributed to a microscopic injury to the growth plate or apophysis. where the tendon attaches to the inner elbow. Pain and loss of motion are common symptoms of little league elbow. Pitchers sustain the majority of injuries but any player may develop it from overuse. X-rays are very important as part of the work up for little league elbow. Comparison x-rays can be helpful in certain cases to evaluate the extent of the injury. The UCL (ulnar collateral ligament) can be involved in severe cases. If the apophysis or UCL origin is significantly displaced, surgery may be indicated. If the ligament is completely torn, a formal UCL reconstruction (Tommy John procedure) may be needed to return to competitive throwing. Prevention of overuse injury in the throwing athlete is critical to avoid long term injury. Injury to the young athlete's elbow may be prevented by limiting the number of pitches in a game or practice, allowing the athlete adequate rest after throwing, and limiting the number of teams that he or she plays on. Recent studies demonstrate that the fast ball may be worse than breaking pitches for the immature elbow, causing the growth plate to separate or ligament to fail. Fortunately, most athletes can return to their sport after adequate rest and rehabilitation.

School Custodian by Day, Artist by Night On a Mission to Raise \$1 Million for Worthwhile Causes

Most people dream about what they would do if they were given \$1 million. Some might buy a house, pay down debt, or even travel the world.

For local artist Joseph Gormley, his mission is simple: Earn \$1 million -- but make sure it ends up in the hands of others, especially those who need it most.

Gormley is a Tamarac resident, originally from Scotland, who works as a school custodian by day and an acclaimed artist on nights and weekends. Gormley doesn't typically sell his paintings for profit. Instead, he donates them to local nonprofits and foundations who auction them to raise funds for worthy causes like children's medical expenses, youth sports initiatives, and more.

Gormley's paintings often earn anywhere from \$9,000 to \$15,000 per bid. So far, his work has garnered nearly \$300,000 in donations total, but Gormley is determined to keep painting and giving until his works of art, primarily celebrity portraits, have raised at least \$1 million.

"My paycheck is for my family, but my artwork is for the community," Gormley said.

It might surprise some that Gormley's art is worth so much. He has no formal training, and his wife bought him his first paint set just over a decade ago as a Christmas gift, and the school children he interacts with during his day job aren't exactly the target audience for fine art.

Still, somehow, by making all the right connections, harnessing a lot of natural talent, and conjuring a "wee" bit of luck (as they say in Scotland) Gormley's work has earned him a reputation among the upper echelon, made his art sought after at local charity events, and, ultimately, propelled his success.

Perhaps his most jaw-dropping interaction to date is with

none other than Lionel Messi. A mutual connection alerted Messi's family to Gormley's Messi portraits and they fell in love with his work. Messi signed and returned three portraits and decided to keep a fourth in his new Fort Lauderdale home.

The interaction with Messi inspired Gormley to aim for another big dream: earning a spot in the Guinness Book of World Records. This year, Gormley has been circulating one of his many Messi portraits throughout South Florida communities recruiting everyday people to paint a few swipes on the canvas. Gormley hopes to achieve the record for "Most People Painting on One Community Canvas" by the end of the year.

"We've had about 200 people paint on the canvas so far, and we are trying for more," Gormley said. "Thousands of people paint Messi every day, but not everybody has a community-based canvas."

Gormley is not stopping there. He recently partnered with The 72 Chocolate Collection to have his art included on their chocolate bar packaging. Those who purchase a bar from the Swirl line will have a portion of proceeds donated to help provide children access to healthy meals.

Even though Gormley is a community man at heart – his family has lived in Coral Springs and Tamarac, and he has worked in Coral Springs and Parkland schools -- Gormley hopes to someday gain national recognition for his efforts if it will help to achieve his many goals. Although, for Gormley, the goal is to never paint himself in a self-centered light, but rather to always help others.

"I don't want fame; fame comes with a price," Gormley said. "I want to help as many people as possible."



Pool safety barriers and water alarms are also helpful tools to keep little ones safe. Finally, it's imperative for someone in the household to know CPR so that they someone can respond immediately in an emergency.

Heat Safety:

During scorching summer days, hydration is key. Drink plenty of water throughout the day, especially if spending time outdoors. Be mindful of children consuming energy and caffeinated beverages as they are not a replacement for water. Remember to seek shade or air-conditioned spaces during peak heat hours, typically between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

Fireworks Safety:

As the Fourth of July holiday approaches, fireworks become a popular way to celebrate. However, they can also be dangerous if not handled properly. Attending the City of Coral Springs Fourth of July event on Thursday, July 4 is the safest way to view fireworks handled by professionals. Never allow children to handle fireworks, and always keep a bucket of water or a hose nearby in case of emergencies.

Residents are reminded to review and update their family's emergency plan, ensure that disaster supply kits are stocked with essential items like water, non-perishable food, medications, and important documents.
